So as soon as we heard that Cornerstone was opening a supportive housing location in Westboro right near our home, we were there painting, unpacking new furniture and helping new residents move in and settle in their new home. But once Princeton was up and operating, what was there for Rick to do at a women's shelter? Well, Rosemary Jones, who is never short of ideas, came up with the idea of Bingo at Princeton.

We have become kindly known as Mrs and Mr Bingo over the years and have

developed close bonds with many of the residents. As an added bonus, we've all developed our own unique rules and games which we call "Princeton-style Bingo". Everyone looks forward to our Wednesday evening games every other week, exemplified by a regular welcoming committee waiting at the front door, thank you Elizabeth! Rick also gives his time as a volunteer driver for Cornerstone and is always there when occasional helping hands are needed.

Eccles Update



Cornerstone is thrilled to have acquired our fifth supportive housing residence, Eccles Housing Residence that will house 46 women and gender-diverse people currently experiencing homelessness in Ottawa. We are grateful to have the opportunity to build on our successful herstory of housing vulnerable women in Ottawa.

Cornerstone has been a leader in providing safe, supportive, and affordable homes for nearly 40 years.

The building is currently being renovated, the walls are getting painted, the floors are being laid, the bathrooms and kitchenettes are starting to be constructed. We hope to open our Eccles Residence in the spring of 2024. One of the many things that make our supportive housing residences so incredible is the numerous partnerships we have with other organizations that provide specialized services to meet our residents' individual needs.

Residents will be able to access free, non-judgemental health services through Ottawa Inner City Health. Women struggling with their mental health will be able to receive services through the Canadian Mental Health Association. Indigenous residents can reconnect with their culture through Minwaashin Lodge. Queer, transgender, and gender non-conforming residents will have specialized support through Kind Space. We have a special partnership with the Elizabeth Fry Society where previously incarcerated women will be able to access supportive housing.

Our supportive housing residence will also operate with staff onsite 24/7 to provide around-the-clock care to residents as they need.We're more than a home, we're a community of support and that includes all of you.

Resident Spotlight: Meet Alaina

Alaina's journey began in Brockville, where a difficult family situation led her to a women's shelter. Her path eventually brought her to Ottawa, where she found herself at our doorstep, scared and uncertain of what lays ahead. **Contrary to her expectations, Alaina was met with warmth and compassion from our dedicated staff.**

Over time, Cornerstone became more than a shelter to Alaina. It became a sanctuary, a place where she found solace, support, and a sense of belonging. Through the darkest moments of her life, our staff stood by her side and provided the care she needed.



Alaina's journey took her through various phases, from shelter living to the 515 Maclaren Supportive Housing Residence. Here, she discovered a vibrant community of women and embarked on a path toward independence. With the guidance of our outreach program and the mentorship of our committed staff members, Alaina secured a job at Loblaws, a testament to her strength and determination.

Yet, life has a way of testing our resolve, and in the face of unimaginable loss, Alaina found herself once again seeking refuge in Cornerstone. Her beloved service dog, Stewart, was a pillar of support through many trials, and his passing left a void that seemed insurmountable. Through her grief, Alaina leaned on Cornerstone, finding comfort and a renewed sense of purpose in the arms of our community.

More recently, Alaina faced another heart-wrenching challenge, as her new companion, Teddy, was stolen from her home. This cruel twist of fate has tested her resilience, but through it all, Cornerstone has remained a beacon of support, offering solace and strength.

Alaina's story is a testament to the transformative power of community and the impact of your donations. Your generosity enables Cornerstone to provide a lifeline for women like Alaina, offering them a chance to rebuild their lives and find hope once more.

World Homeless Day


